## Romans 13.8-end

Owe no one anything, except to love one another; for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. The commandments, 'You shall not commit adultery; You shall not murder; You shall not steal; You shall not covet'; and any other commandment, are summed up in this word, 'Love your neighbour as yourself.' Love does no wrong to a neighbour; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law.

Besides this, you know what time it is, how it is now the moment for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers; the night is far gone, the day is near. Let us then lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armour of light; let us live honourably as in the day, not in revelling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarrelling and jealousy. Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

## Matthew 18.15-20

'If another member of the church sins against you, go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone. If the member listens to you, you have regained that one. But if you are not listened to, take one or two others along with you, so that every word may be confirmed by the evidence of two or three witnesses. If the member refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if the offender refuses to listen even to the church, let such a one be to you as a Gentile and a tax-collector. Truly I tell you, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven. Again, truly I tell you, if two of you agree on earth about anything you ask, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them.'

**Commemorated this week** - Cyprian Bishop, Martyr (15<sup>th</sup> September).

Born in North Africa in the early years of the third century AD, Cyprian was an orator and a 'pleader in the courts'. Converting to Christianity he was elected shortly afterwards as Bishop of Carthage around 249 AD. Persecution began following the demand by the Roman administration that all citizens had to make sacrifices to the gods. Facing the likelihood of execution, Cyprian left Carthage. Controversy arose at this time over the treatment and re-admittance of the many Christians who had fallen away from the faith (the lapsi). Upon returning to his diocese, Cyprian convened Council of North African bishops in Carthage. His middle way, between those who favoured little or no public penance by the lapsi and those who rejected any reconciliation whatsoever was generally supported by the Council. Cyprian was also a noted early Christian writer. Banished from Carthage as further persecution began, he was later recalled and after a period of virtual house arrest was executed on the 14<sup>th</sup> September 258 AD. In the Church of England Cyprian is commemorated on the 15<sup>th</sup> September.
